### **How To Reach Punjabi University, Patiala**

Punjabi University, Patiala, Punjab is located on the Chandigarh-Patiala-Bathinda National Highway No. 22, about 7 kms. from Patiala city (15 minutes journey), nearly 50 kms. from Ambala cantonment (1 hour journey), about 70 kms. from Chandigarh (1:30 hours journey) and approximately 251 kms. from New Delhi (about 5:30 hours journey). The nearest Airport is Chandigarh International Airport (approximately 1:30 hours journey). The nearest Railway Stations are Patiala City jn: (7 kms. & 10 minutes journey), Rajpura jn: (25 kms. & 30 minutes journey) and Ambala cant. jn: (50 kms. & 1 hour journey). Taxi charges from New Delhi Airport to Patiala vary between Rs. 3000-6000 (rates negotiable). Following routes may be taken to reach Punjabi University, Patiala:

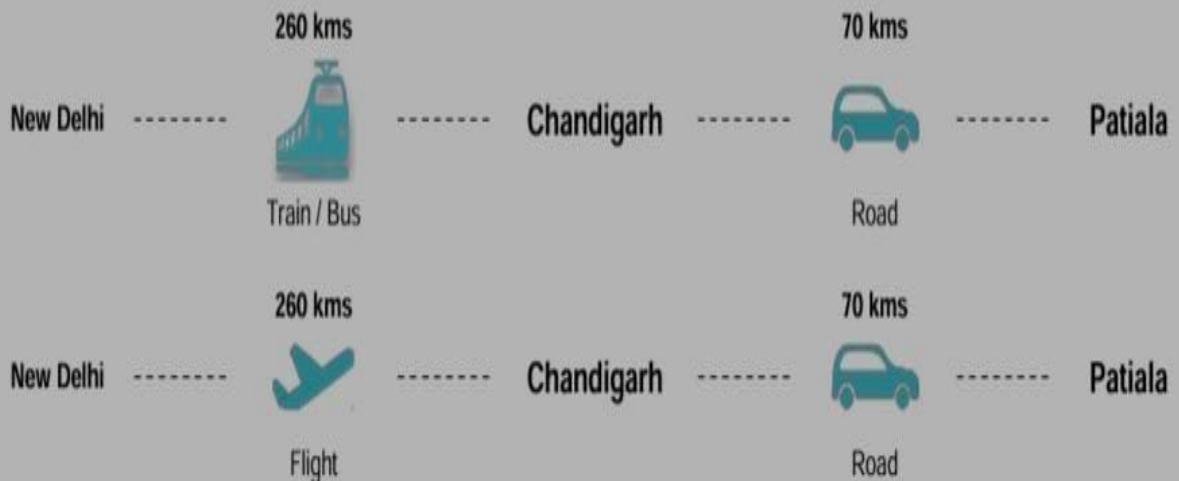


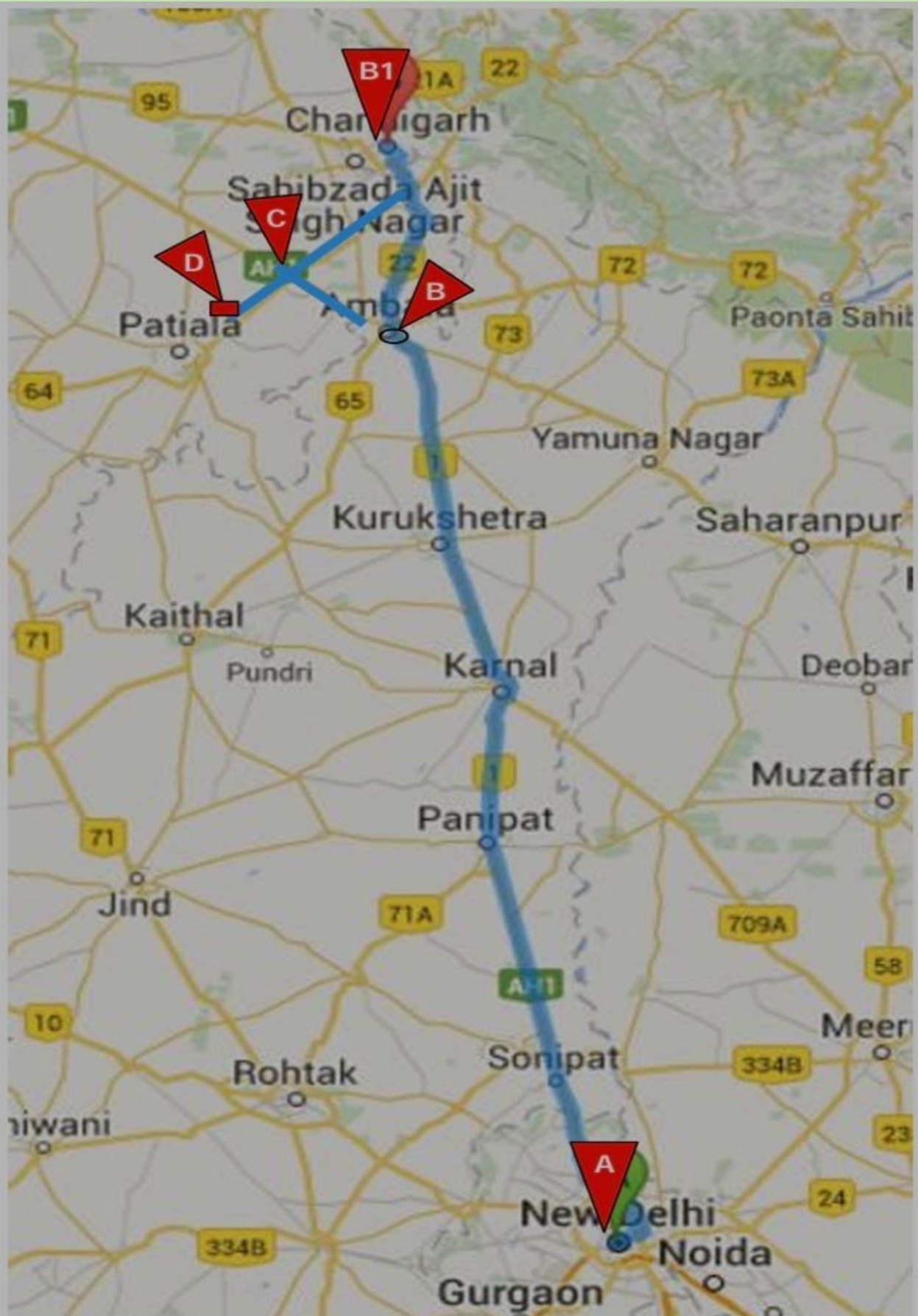
## Indirect Connectivity

## 7<sup>th</sup> TSoED Conference Invitation

**The faculty members, researchers and students are invited to share their thoughts / views on ‘ Towards Inclusive and Sustainable Rural Development in India: Socio-Economic Challenges and Pathways ’, in the light of the following:**

Rural development, an enhancement procedure in the quality of life and economic well-being in rural communities, must have an element of inclusivity in it, meaning thereby that the gains of economic development, infrastructural growth, and enriched social services should also reach all members of rural populations, particularly the marginalised groups, women, and small farmers and labour class. This process prioritises equal opportunities, livelihood security, and the active participation of marginalised communities and women in grassroots growth. It consists of a multi-pronged strategy in development of infrastructure, agriculture, food security, skill development, education, healthcare, and livelihood generation to bridge the gap between rural and urban areas as well as to reduce poverty and reduce socio-economic disparities through targeted empowerment, livelihood creation, and capacity building. However, this is hindered by structural issues like agrarian distress and limited livelihoods, over-reliance on low-productive agriculture, fragmented landholdings, health and education related infrastructural deficiency, limited non-farm employment, social and gender inequalities, along with the vulnerability to climate change. Although the central government has launched / initiated many a welfare and development schemes and programs like the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS), now known as Viksit Bharat Guarantee for Rozgar and Aajivika Mission (Gramin), providing assured wage employment, Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY) and micro-credit platforms aimed to bring the marginalised into the formal banking system, and the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) focusing on skill development for rural youth, still, much needs to be done in this direction. The present conference aims to bring the economists, planners and policy makers on a common platform to discuss, analyse and infer on the issues related to inclusive rural development, and provide appropriate and pointed solutions and suggestions in this direction.
